Consisting of five themed areas, The Army and Society Gallery chronicles the relationship between the Army, its civilian government, and the people.



PRESERVING THE NATION **GALLERY**

WHERE TO FIND IT: FIRST FLOOR

The Preserving the Nation Gallery gives visitors an understanding of the Army's part in the defining American event of the 19th century, the Civil War.



GLOBAL WAR GALLERY



The Global War Gallery portrays the Army's role in the Allied victory during World War II. Visitors learn about both the European and Pacific Theaters, technology, the Army's air war, and the development of the atomic bomb.



"OF NOBLE DEEDS" FILM



The film, "Of Noble Deeds," explores what it means to truly be an American Soldier and includes recreations of some of the Army's most significant battles.



FOUNDING THE NATION GALLERY

WHERE TO FIND IT: FIRST FLOOR

This gallery covers the colonial period to the War of 1812. Visitors explore the origins of the Continental Army, its role in the Revolutionary War, and more.




WORLD WAR I IMMERSION EXPERIENCE


